COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (CIL)

WHAT IS the Community Infrastructure Levy?

- The Community Infrastructure Levy, known as CIL, is a mandatory charge levied on new development.
- Selby District Council adopted CIL in January 2016 and monies received are to be used on infrastructure needs within the district.
- A proportion of the monies received are required to be passed on to the Parish in which the development has commenced.

HOW MUCH MONEY has been passed to Newton Kyme cum Toulston?

• The Council has received a total of £6,946.65 and the money must be used by April 2024.

WHAT CAN THE MONEY BE USED FOR?

The monies should be spent by the Parish Council in accordance with the CIL Regulations, as below:

• 'The provision, improvement, replacement, operation or maintenance of infrastructure'

OR

• 'anything else that is concerned with addressing the demands that the development places on an area'

"Infrastructure" includes physical, social and green infrastructure e.g. Highways; cycleways; education facilities; sports and community halls; parks and play areas.

CIL monies can be used to fund, or match funding with other income streams, or may be spent collaboratively with other parish/town councils, community interest companies or other providers to make the most efficient use of funding to benefit the community.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

While the amount of money is not large, it is important that it is used to maximum effect for the benefit of the community.

To inform the decision on what the money should be used for, the Parish Council needs to know what is important to the community and is inviting <u>YOU</u> to let us know <u>YOUR</u> ideas.
